Pumpkin Carving Competition!

Mathletics—New Avatar System

What's in the new avatar system? To create their new avatars, your child will need to earn Mathletics points. They can earn points by completing Mathletics activities, Skill Quests, or a game of Live Mathletics.

In the new Avatar Maker system, children will also notice a new Mathletics currency called M coins. One point earned in Mathletics converts to one M Coin. These M coins do not reset so your students can keep accumulating them.

If your students haven't earned any

coins yet, they'll still be able to create a base avatar. However, earning more coins gives them the ability to choose more backgrounds and features to decorate their characters.

So keep encouraging your children to build their skills in Mathletics and earn more points!

Plus, the new Avatar Maker won't disrupt the work you set, as it's limited to a maximum of 10 minutes per student a day.

Mathletics usually costs £5 pounds per child per year. We originally suggested that parents may pay for this. However,

we've been lucky enough that a local business has offered to sponsor £4 per child at Glencull. Therefore the cost to parents is £1 per child this year. This represents excellent value for families at Glencull

Music

The EA music service teaches in the tradition of classical music tuition, which involves reading musical score. We offer violin, drums, and flute from P4 up. If your child is interested contact Mr Gormley.

Our other instrumental music service in school, run by Nuala Sweeney, is taught using Irish Traditional (Comhaltas) tuition. The Mrs Sweeney teaches tin whistle. If you play another traditional instrument



outside school (banjo, flute, fiddle etc.) she also involves those instruments. This entails using your 'ear' to follow the music with less sight reading. In St Malachy's we advise that going through both types of tuition is best, as it will allow for more enjoyment of the music, and more opportunities for playing, both now and in the future.

This year's Halloween Party will take place in school on Thursday 26th Oct during the school day. The children come to school dressed up for a day of craic and learning activities.

Uniforms

The labels and markings often come off so checking them is a huge help with identifying owners of lost property.

Seskilgreen Urn

At dusk on the evening of 3rd October 1959, a sandy hill immediately behind Glencull Public Elementary school, townland Seskilgreen, about two miles west of Ballygawley on the Omagh road, was being quarried for "filling the new A5 road". Half of the hill had been removed, and the crest of the hill was now on top of the "face", which was here 35 to 40 feet high, and continually sliding down. The men working there saw something at the top of the bank for a time, and they say it was "like a bucket upside down" and only a foot or so below the surface. Soon afterwards there was a slide and the "face" came down. A clay 'Urn' rolled down the hill. One side of an 'urn' was broken in three large pieces. It was about

one-third full of small very dry pieces of *human bone* pressed into the bottom and held there by a mass of grass roots and some sand.

The bones were found to be of a person who lived between 2000-4000 years ago!!

P4/5 are studying Egypt and the Bronze age 4000 years ago. They'll visit the Armagh Museum next Thursday 5th Oct to see the Seskilgreen Urn and to learn more about early man and how life was 4000 years ago.
